SPORTS FIXTURE MEETING

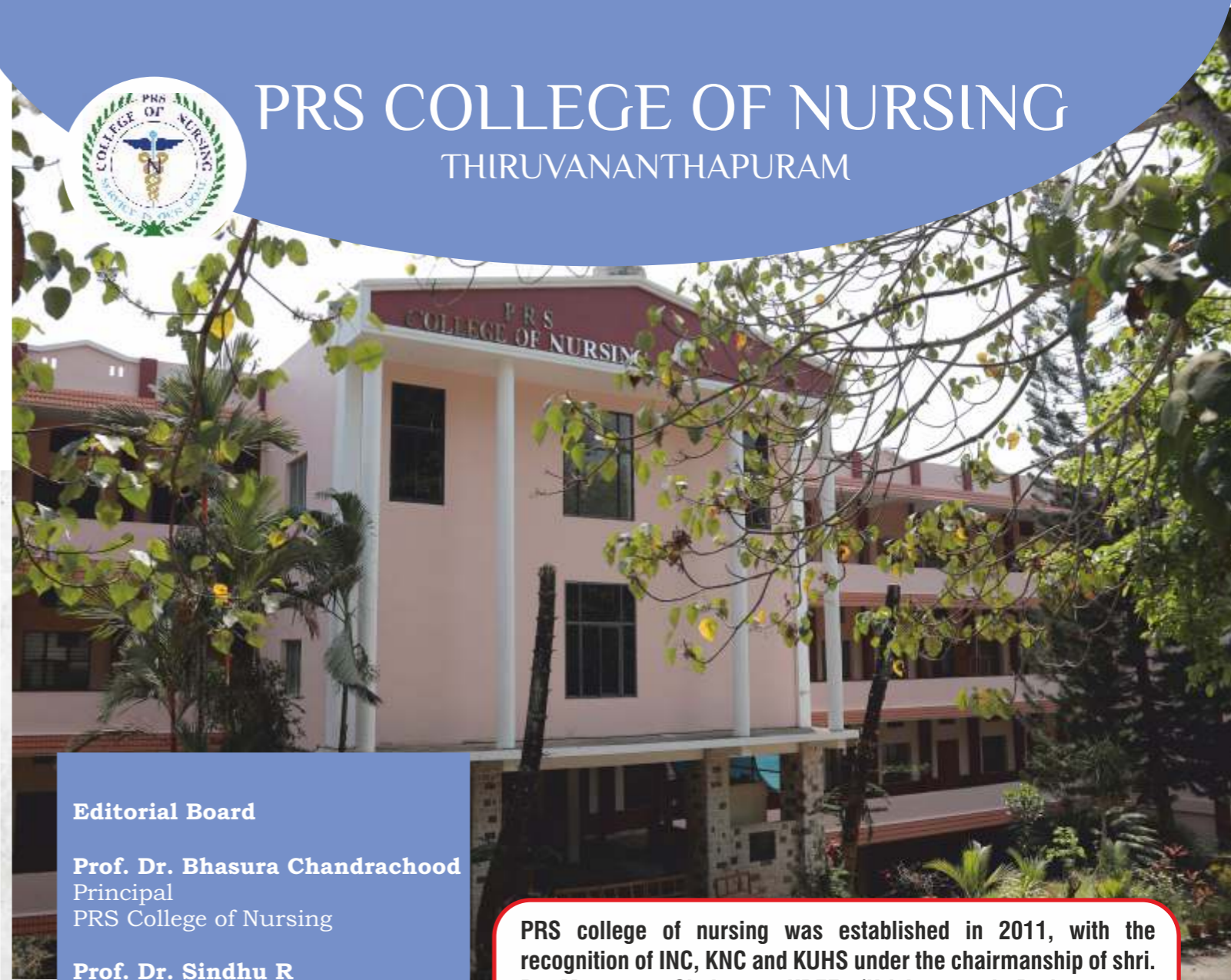

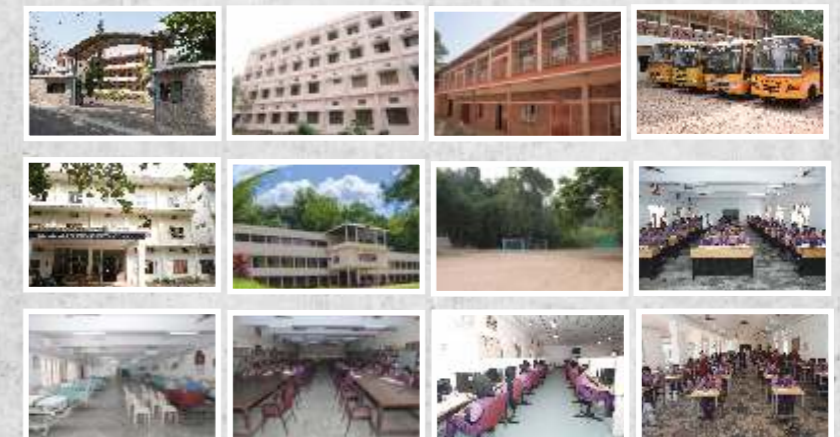

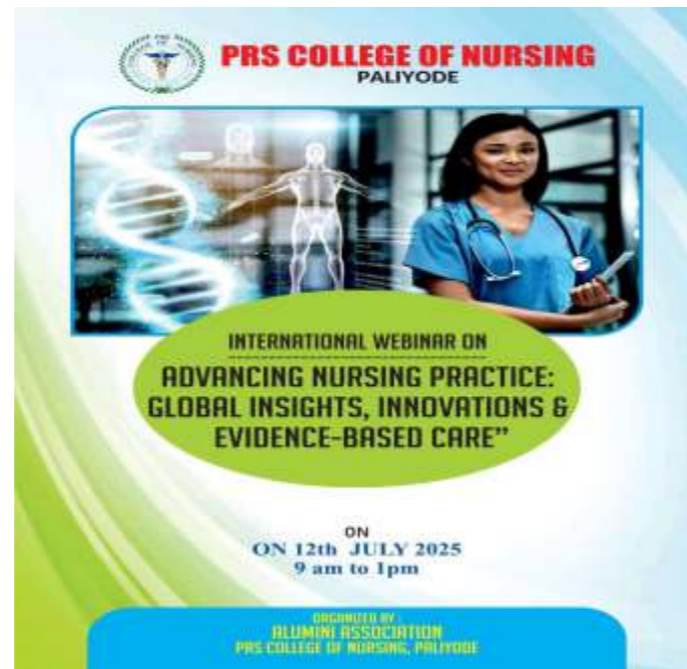


RESEARCH WORLD DAY
